B Team prevail in Byki derby

Joe Gambino has been a player with the Byki A Team since 1999 and is one of the coaches of the B Team. As the day approached for the teams to meet in a competitive match, he said that players from both sides were eager to show the other side who was better. "The guys in the A Team believe they are the better team," said Gambino. "But the guys on the B team are the like the little brother who always wants to beat his big brother." The teams met on July 11 and the little brothers proved that they were plenty big, as the B Team handed the A Team a stinging 3:1 defeat.

The B Team overwhelmed the A Team with aggressive defending and commitment to winning the 50-50 balls. Quite often, the A Team found themselves to be a step slow and the B Team took full advantage. The blitzed the Byki goal to grab the early lead and then put their stamp on the match with two quick strikes just after the break. The A Team put up a concerted effort in the game's final 20 minutes, but it was far too late to mount an effective comeback.

The B Team put pressure on the A Team from the outset. Newcomer Matthias Zoeller sent a well-placed cross into A

Team penalty area. When Russ Haynes crashed into Paul Mansur to take him out of the play, it was left to Eamon Colwell to finish the play for the B Team. Colwell shot directly at Ryan Eliasek from short range, but Eliasek used his quick reflexes to make the save. The rebound went right back to Colwell, who made no mistake on the second try and the B Team were on a roll.

Although the A Team managed to settle down after the shocking start, the B Team was dominating the tempo of the match. The A Team experienced difficulty in maintaining possession and resorted to launching long passes that lacked a definite target. You can't score if you don't have the ball and Jorge de la Cruz was hardly challenged by the A Team in the first 45 minutes.

Coach George Gorecki told his team at halftime that they had to make a bigger commitment to moving off the ball and marking more tightly. Marek Ciszewski summed up the situation pretty accurately. "The B Team were playing like it was a competitive game," he said. "We were playing like we were out there to get 90 minutes of exercise."

That increase in commitment didn't materialize until the game was out of hand. The B Team kept up their intensity in the second half and it paid off handsomely. In the 55th minute, Haynes crossed the ball into Zoeller, who laid it off for Andy Lane. The midfielder curled his shot into the top corner from distance to make it 2:0 to the B Team.

The B Team didn't stop there and were up by three just four minutes later. A weak backpass to Eliasek left the goalkeeper in peril. Zoeller saw an opportunity and put pressure on Eliasek, who reached the ball first, but his clearance deflected off of Zoeller high into the air. Haynes sprinted to the loose ball and redirected a soft header into the unguarded goal for a 3:0 lead.

Gorecki changed his team's formation to a 3-4-3 to get more attacking players forward. The tactic would expose the A Team backline to more pressure and that pressure should



have led to the night's easiest goal. Haynes dispossessed stopper Jason Bant and then rounded Eliasek, only to push the ball wide of the gaping open net.

The desperation of the A Team turned their game in the right direction, as they finally began moving the ball quickly and finding openings in the B Team's defense along the flanks. With 13 minutes left in the game, Chris Moore sent a cross into the box that forced de la Cruz off his line. De la Cruz spilled the ball inside the goal box and Zach Dance knocked the loose ball into the net.

That goal proved to be too little, too late, but the A Team didn't play like a beaten team. They kept pushing and Gambino narrowly missed closing the gap to 3:2 with a volley from 30 yards that hit the top of the crossbar.

The result takes the two teams in opposite directions. The B Team are just two points away from the top six, but two of their last three round-robin matches are against Lemont FC and Royal FC, who are the leaders of the 1st Division. The A Team are now resigned to finishing out the season in the Classification Section, which will be the name of the

group that contains the bottom six teams. The squads have used the mid-season break to prepare for the remainder of the season with a full arsenal.
