Byki wait too long to come back

The Byki oldboys made a spirited comeback from a 5:1 second-half deficit last Friday when they took on NK Prijedor, but they came up short at the end, as the Bosnians walked away 6:4 winners. It was an unfortunate outcome, but the Byki have only themselves to blame for their defensive lapses.

Slack marking was the topic of the day in the first half of the contest. Prijedor used a very direct approach to attack the Byki and the Byki always appeared to be a step behind the action. Before long, Prijedor had built a 3:0 lead.

Prijedor used smart ball movement to find the open man to set up their first score. The Byki left players open and paid the ultimate price, as Prijedor swung the ball from left to right, leaving a forward with a wide-open shot.

The Byki came right back in their search for an equalizer. Russ Haynes drilled a free kick from the red line that forced the keeper to make a diving stop. Just 0:20 later, Marek Ciszewski fired a long-range bomb that had the keeper beaten. Ciszewski, however, could not beat the goalpost and the Byki were still down 1:0.

Prijedor upped their lead to 2:0 with 8:29 left in the half.

After winning the ball deep in the corner, a Prijedor player made a simple square pass to an unmarked teammate in the box. He fired past a helpless Ray Najera. Four minutes later, a sloppy Byki turnover in their own end led to a long-distance shot that screamed into the upper corner of the goal to make it 3:0

Ciszewski pulled one back just 1:04 later with an excellent individual effort. His free kick from the Prijedor red line hit the boards. Ciszewski chased down the rebound and shot again. The keeper made the save, but left the rebound for Ciszewski, who made no mistake on the third try.

The Byki came out after the break looking to take control of the match and peppered the Prijedor goal with shots, and even hit the framework twice more. But Prijedor survived the barrage and even added another goal to their total.

Haynes won a loose ball at the Prijedor red line after 0:43 and blasted a shot that froze the goalie and clanged off of the base of the goalpost. Minutes later, the hard-working Matt Fleming won the ball in the corner and dropped a pass for Ciszewski at the top of the box. The keeper made a nice save on Ciszewski's first-time shot.

Prijedor made it 4:1 with 12:23 left in the contest when they made the most of a counterattack with a shot from the right flank. The Byki left their goalkeeper stranded 3:52 later when they made an ill-advised line change. Prijedor had time and space, punishing the Byki to the tune of a 5:1 lead.

Just when it looked like all hope was lost, the Byki offense kicked into gear. Just 0:24 after the fifth Prijedor goal, Haynes answered by burying a shot from outside the area to bring the Byki to within 5:2.

Momentum shifted to the Byki with 7:15 to go when an unmarked Tony Gallo dribbled the ball up the gut and drilled a shot from long range. The keeper could only parry the ball and Haynes was in just the right spot to tuck home the rebound.

The Byki closed the gap to 5:4 with 6:09 left. Dan Jedrzejowski nailed a hard shot from the right wing and the



ball deflected off of a defender. Ciszewski pounced on the loose ball and slotted past the startled goalkeeper.

Suddenly, the Byki were rocking and Prijedor were reeling. With 5:03 to go, Joe Gambino was trapped in the corner, to the right of the Prijedor goalkeeper. He dug the ball out of the scrum and dropped it back to Matt Treter. The winger hit a first-time shot that was destined for the far post. The ball hit the inside of the post and cruelly rebounded off to the side. "I was ready to ring up Matt's shot on the scoreboard," said coach George Gorecki. "He had everyone beaten and that ball should have gone in."

Prijedor recovered sufficiently to snatch another goal with 4:27 left to provide a bit of breathing room. The Byki would

come no closer, but everyone realized how narrow the margin between victory and defeat can be. "Prijedor capitalized on our poor attention to defense," said Gorecki afterward. "We hit the framework four times, so we put plenty of pressure on them. It's a matter of putting it together on both sides of the ball."

Byki can't solve packed-in Real

The Byki dropped to 0-0-2 to start the indoor season when they disappointingly fell 3:1 to Real Independiente last Friday. Real played a good portion of the match with just one substitute and a disjointed Byki attack failed to capitalize. The Byki defense was not up to the standard they set in Week 1, allowing Real to shoot at the Byki goal from all angles.

Coach Joe Gambino has been stressing the need for the Byki to maintain ball possession, and his players could hardly have been worse in that aspect of the game than they were on Friday. Many players held the ball too long, dribbled too much, and generally disdained making the easy pass. With Real defenders occupying space in front of the Byki goal, a patient approach was called for, but few Byki realized the importance of changing their game to force the opponent into jeopardy situations.

Real got off to a dream start when they broke into the lead after only 0:38 had elapsed. The Byki defended in a passive fashion and Real calmly stroked the ball from one side to the other. An open player blasted a shot from the right side just under Ryan Eliasek's crossbar.

The Byki needed just 3:50 to reply. A free kick from the right corner whizzed through the Real penalty area and over to Jeff Samp on the left flank. Samp tried to shoot for the far post, but Dan Stanley ran through the middle and redirected the ball past the keeper with a well-taken, first-time shot.

The Byki nearly snatched the lead 0:58 later when Josh Taylor broke behind the defense and had the keeper alone. Real's goalie made a forceful intervention and slid at Taylor's feet to block the shot.

Real grabbed the lead with 1:38 left in the first half. A long shot crashed off of the back boards and caromed into

the middle of the Byki penalty area. An unmarked Real player slammed the loose ball past Eliasek.

The Byki made little progress to solve the Real defense after the break. They failed to move the ball quickly to take advantage of space and Real comfortably packed themselves in and dared the Byki to come at them.

Real could have padded their lead with 10:11 left in the contest. After the Byki defense allowed a Real player to dribble freely up the middle, it was left up to Eliasek to save the day. Eliasek stoned the shooter with a brilliant save, but Real controlled the rebound. The second shot hit both goalposts and incredibly did not cross the line.

The Byki had a gilt-edged chance to equalize with 3:47 to go. Taylor received a pass at midfield and sprinted toward the Real goal. As he crossed the red line, he teed up a long-range bomb that the keeper never saw. The ball ricocheted off of the underside of the crossbar and was cleared by the defense.

Gambino rolled the dice with a little more than three minutes left in the game and went to six-attacker mode, replacing Eliasek with Samp. The Byki attacked with more urgency, but got no closer to scoring. Real got a slop goal in the waning moments as they victimized Samp to cap off a 2 v 1 counterattack.

Venture peppered the Byki goal with long-distance shots and their uncanny accuracy only encouraged them to shoot at every opportunity. The long bombs led Venture to a 4:1 lead at the break.

In the second half, the Byki abandoned their defensive posture and decided to throw all of their effort into attacking. It's an all-or-nothing strategy, and it came up nothing for the Byki. Venture utilized the space to full advantage and they broke the game open when they blitzed the Byki for four goals in the span of three minutes in the second half. After that outburst, the Byki were simply a beaten bunch.
